President's Column

2005 went out as fast as it came in and a lot happened on the way. In Annapolis no new anti-gun laws got thru and we came close to getting the ballistic finger printing law thrown out after it was shown it was a waste of tax payers money because it does not work and does nothing for crime control. In a feeble attempt the assault weapons ban was tried again and lost again in the judiciary committee, because the majority of the committee members remembered the true facts that were brought out last year that showed the lies of the anti-gun groups. It seems that after three years of getting nothing for their efforts, the head of Cease Fire of Maryland, Leah Barrett, resigned.

On the national front, final passage of S.397-The Protection of Lawful Commerce in Arms Act was passed and signed into law by President Bush to stop the predatory lawsuits against our firearm industry. Said Senator William Frist of Tennessee "We have to place the blame where it belongs. We need to place it at the feet of the violent criminals themselves, those who commit the crimes and threaten our communities. They are the ones responsible, and they are the ones who should be held accountable. Blaming gun manufactures misses the real problem. It punishes law-abiding owners and undermines our constitutionally protected rights."

Also around the state there were a lot of shooting activities going on. 3P-Air Gun sent about 10 JR shooters on to the National Air Gun matches in Kentucky and Idaho to represent our state and did rather well. And with two being invited to the Olym-

Report from Camp Perry

2005 was a great year for the Maryland State Rifle Team. Thirty-two members traveled to Camp Perry, Ohio, on the shores of Lake Erie to compete in the National Rifle Championships. The National Rifle Championships consist of a number of individual and team matches fired under the auspices of the Director of the Civilian Marksmanship Program and in cooperation with the National Rifle Association. The principal matches are the President's Trophy Match, the National Individual Trophy Match, the National Trophy Team Match and the National Trophy Infantry Team Match. There are also several additional matches including the Whistler Boy Team Match (an NRA-sponsored event for junior 2-person teams), the Springfield Match (for military bolt action rifles), the M-16 Excellence-in-Competition Match (for those that have no points accrued toward their Distinguished Rifleman Badge), and the Garand Match (for service grade Garand Rifles or other similar vintage U.S. military arms).

The Rifle Team's performance in the National Trophy Team Match continues to improve as our firing members gain experience and we continue to increase the depth of our "bench." This year the Red Team finished 16th out 59 teams firing in the National Trophy Team Match. The Team Captain was Jeff Davis, Coach was John Harrison and firing members were Larry Moreland, John Ondek, Clay Miller, Rich Kussman, Matt Daley, and Bill Perry. If we take out the military teams, Maryland finished 9th out of 47 civilian teams. We also entered another team, the Blue Team, with Glenn Reisinger as the Team Captain, Alan Lashley as the Team Coach, and firing members of James Bowen, Charlie Leatherman, Jenn Brostek, Dan Pekala, Doug Self, and Dave Gorzsas.

The National Trophy Team Match is fired with the Service Rifle over the National Match Course. That means only M1 Garands, M-14s or M-16s (and their civilian equivalents) can be fired. The rifles, with minor changes authorized in the sights, must have the outward appearance of the issued service rifle for the U.S. Armed Forces. Almost all competitors now fire the M-16/AR-15-type rifles. They have proven to be more accurate and require less maintenance to maintain match winning characteristics.

In the National Trophy Infantry Trophy Team Match, both of our teams continued to have bad luck. The Infantry Trophy Match, commonly referred to as "Rattle Battle" is fired with service rifles (see above) in a flurry of shots fired at E-type and F-type silhouettes at 600, 500, 300 and 200 yards. Essentially the Rattle Battle is a controlled simulation of an infantry squad assault on a enemy defensive position. Each squad of 6 shooters is allowed 384 rounds of ammunition that can be distributed in any way for the entire match. Initially competitors engage the E-type silhouette at 600 yards from the prone position and may fire as many shots as they desire in a 50-second time period. There are no alibis in this match, so if a rifle malfunctions, it has to be cleared during the 50-second time period or the shots are not counted. Only hits on the silhouette count for score. Next everyone on the line (multiple squads at the Nationals) advance to the 500-yard line together. There each team, on command, assumes a prone position and again engages the E-type silhouette in another 50-second time period. Once scores are received, the squads advance to the 300-yard line

Official By-Laws
of the Maryland
State Rifle & Pistol Association
Revised July 8, 1989

PREAMBLE

In accordance with the purposes and objectives of the National Rifle Association, the objectives of this association shall be to create a public sentiment for the encouragement of training in the use of firearms as a sport, as an essential contribution to National Security, and as maintenance of individual liberty and for personal defense.

The purpose of this organization will be to encourage proper organization, operation and administration of member clubs; to promote and coordinate statewide activities related to the ownership and use of firearms and to cooperate with other organizations in the conservation of natural resources within the State of Maryland and throughout the United States.

NRA Sets 2006 Women On Target Hunt Schedule

Fairfax, VA-The National Rifle Association's Women On Target® program, which continues to be one of the easiest and most popular ways for women to begin hunting, has just released its 2006 hunt schedule. NRA's women-only hunts create ideal opportunities for novice or experienced women hunters to pursue a variety of game species in different locales.

"Making it easier for more women to get involved in hunting and the shooting sports is a priority for NRA," said Mary Sue Faulkner, Director of NRA's Community Service Programs Division. "Women On Target is a key part of that effort-and at the rate some of these hunts sell out, it is clear that women are eager for hunting opportunities."

Since the program's launch in late 1999, women of all experience levels have been invited to take part. Hunts are chosen after careful screening of outfitters, and a range of destinations and cost levels are offered. For 2006 and early 2007, Women On Target will travel to new and exciting hunting destinations, as well as returning to the sites of some of its most popular hunts. New hunts for whitetail deer in South Carolina and deer, hog, coyote, and bobcat in Alabama will join already popular pheasant, wild boar, and antelope hunts from California to Tennessee.

Sandy Cook of Bronston, KY, has participated in several Women On Target hunts. "When I first started hunting and went on my first Women On Target hunt, everyone was so helpful and made me feel very comfortable. As I gained experience, these hunts continued to offer me new challenges. Everyone, from beginners to experienced hunters, has such a great time that I have recommended Women On Target hunts to many other women," she said.

Maryland State High Power Rifle Championship August 20, 2005

The Maryland State high power rifle championship got off on a hot start this year – literally. By 8.00 am the temperature was in the 80's and the humidity was around ninety percent; the air was thick with no wind.

Some time ago we switched around the high power match at Ft Meade where this match is held, to start shooting at the 600yd line first for an 800agg match, because the way the range is located, by around four o'clock in the afternoon you are looking right into the sun, and trying to shoot into this is no fun.

When the last relay left the line for the 600yd portion of the match, with a light overcast sky and heavy humidity and just plain hot some good scores were posted: high master class and match winner was John Harrison III with a 199-9x, with Jon Howell at 197-9x coming in second. In master class, Larry Moreland with a 195-6x came in first with Eric Grove with a 193-6x coming in second. In expert/sharpshooter/marksman combined: First place was Lewis Nibert with a 192-5x and Thomas Gregory with a 185-3x came in second.

Next we moved up to the 200yd line for off-hand and the sun is now coming on strong. Along with the humidity you were sweating more water than you could drink. When this portion was done a lot of people thought they were done too; they were just worn out.

Any way the match winner here was William Lendzinski with a 193-4x in master, also in master class for first place was Matthew Daley with a 188-3x and coming in second was George Brennan with a 187-6x. In high master class John Harrison III won with a 193-2x and coming in second was Jon Howell with a 192-6x. In expert/sharpshooter/marksman combined, Dave Gorzsas with a 190-2x came in first and coming in second was Douglas Self with a 186-6x.

In the 200yd rapid fire event the scores of every one really tighten up and the heat was at its max. Someone had a heat and humidity gauge and it was reading 125 degrees.

The match winner for this portion and high master was Clayton Miller with a 200-9x, with John Harrison III coming in second with 200-8x. In the master class Larry Moreland came in first with 195-5x, and coming in second place was Glenn Reissinger with 194-4x

In the expert/sharpshooter/marksman combined class, Kevin Murphy, a JR shooter, came in first with 197-7x, and Bill Perry came in second with 191-6x.

The 300yd rapid-fire event was the last portion of the State Championship and not every one made it. A few dropped out because of the heat and a few more looked like they were about to. The winner in the high master class was Clayton Miller with 197-10x; coming in second was John Harrison III with 197-5x. In the master class, match winner was Wallace Chance with 199-6x, coming in first place was George Brennan with 191-4x, and coming in second was Larry Moreland with 190-1x.

When it was all over the High Resident/Match Rifle winner was John Harrison III with 789-24x and High Service Rifle winner was Clayton Miller with 779-24x

There was to be a CMP (LEG) excellence in competition match the next day, but it had to be canceled. Because of the extreme heat on Saturday a lot of people did not come back. You need a minimum of 10 non-distinguished shooters to award a "LEG" medal and only nine showed up

Thanks to everyone who did show up and showed their support thru out the season. A special thanks goes to the Chesapeake Rifle & Pistol Club for their on-going support for sponsoring the monthly matches and the State Championship held at the old FT Meade ranges. We couldn't have done it without them.

We hope to see everyone back in 2006 to compete.

and engage an F-type silhouette from the sitting or kneeling position in 50 seconds. Finally, if a squad has any ammunition remaining, they advance to the 200-yard line and shoot from the standing position. It's not advisable to have to shoot standing rapid fire. So everyone tries to expend all their ammunition prior to moving to the 200-yard line. As you can imagine, with all six shooters on every squad firing from 20 to 30 or more rounds in the 50-second time periods the nickname Rattle Battle is quite appropriate.

This year the Maryland Red Team finished 24th out of 43 competing teams. We had some problems with malfunctions that proved to be our undoing. The Red Team was led by Captain Larry Moreland, Coach John Harrison and firing members Jeff Davis, Dan Green, Erich Grove, Steve Maurer, Clay Miller, and Glenn Reisinger. The Blue Team was composed of Captain Rich Kussman, Coach Jenn Brostek and firing members Jim Brady, Wally Chance, Paul Crawford, Matt Daley, Jay Green, and Bill Perry. We plan to get all the bugs out and be more prepared next year.

Maryland fielded two teams for the Whistler Boy Matches. As are all the matches during the Championships, the Whistler Boy is fired with the Service Rifle by two-person teams over the National Match Course. The National Match Course is made up of 10 shots fired slow fire from standing at 200 yards, 10 shots fired from standing to sitting in 60 seconds at 200 yards, 10 shots fired from standing to prone in 70 seconds at 300 yards, and 20 shots fired slow fire from prone at 600 yards. Our Team Captains were Wally Chance and Jenn Brostek; our coaches were Rich Kussman and Greg Blackstock, the juniors were Patrick Murphy, Michael Andrews, Blaine Griffith, and Adam Maurer. The guys did a great job finishing 39th and 85th out of 103 Whistler Boy Teams.

Any highpower rifle competitor in Maryland can be part of the State Rifle Team. All it takes is showing up with an interest in shooting. The Rifle Team has organized practices and shoots in Team Matches prior to the Nationals for training. If you're interested in giving this a try, please contact either Rich Kussman or Larry Moreland. See the back page for our contact numbers.

Also other JR shooters went to the National Matches at Camp Perry for small bore and high power rifle and had a blast. Along with the JR shooters there were around 50 adults that went to Camp Perry, for small-bore rifle, pistol, and high power rifle. We are meeting right now trying to set up clinics for NRA Bulls-eye pistol as well as Trap & Skeet.

Also we will again be helping with the High Power rifle clinic at the AGC ranges at Marriottsville.
