## Camp Perry Report

The Maryland State Rifle Team has returned from Camp Perry, Ohio and the National Rifle Championships. We had 38 participants this year, including 8 juniors. This is the largest turnout we've had for in a long time, especially with the junior participation. The week started out with the Small Arms Firing School, where the U.S. Army Marksmanship Unit familiarized the participants with the M-16 Rifle and basic rifle marksmanship fundamentals. While the adults were learning about the M-16, the juniors were in the Marine Corps Junior

High Power Clinic. They learned a lot about highpower rifle from some of the best shooters in the nation. Tuesday was the President's Match. It actually went surprisingly well and was finished in good time (for Camp Perry). Congratulations are in order for Larry Moreland who made the cut to be in the number 51 spot. **This is Larry's second time in the President's Hundred.** By the way, a junior won the President's Match, this year for the first time ever. So you juniors buckle down so you can be on the stage next year or the year after.

Next we fired the National Trophy Individual Match (NTI), commonly referred to as the Leg Match, on Wednesday. The NTI is

where civilian shooters can earn 10 points toward the 30 required to receive the coveted Distinguished Shooters Badge by finishing in the top 10% of non-Distinguished Shooters. This is usually a long day, even in the most favorable conditions. We went into the match with the threat of rain from the National Weather Service. The first three relays fired their 200 yard scores (offhand and sitting rapid fire)

with no problems. After the pit change took place, light rain ensued. As the next three relays worked their way through the 200-yard program, the rain continued to get heavier and the wind began to blow. By the time we were ready for the 2nd three relays to move back to 300 yards for their prone rapid-fire stage, it was

blowing and raining pretty hard. So, the line called a two-hour delay for the rainsquall to pass. Most of us went back to our huts and got out of the wet clothing as the rain continued to hammer us. After the rain delay, everyone got back on line (well not everyone, some folks called it a day). No sooner had we put the targets in the frames and started to get ready for the 300-yard rapid fire than the rain started again along with the wind! We could barely hold the targets in the frames down in the pits and the forecasters were calling for 45-mph wind gusts within the next 30 minutes. So after we had all the targets in the frames and were trying to keep them from blowing out, they call the match for the day and we put everything back

of the Maryland  
State Rifle & Pistol Association  
Revised July 8, 1989**

**PREAMBLE**

## Maryland State Highpower Rifle Championship For 2004

This year's Highpower Rifle matches across the tri-state region were mostly shot in not so perfect weather. It was either dull and overcast or getting ready or did rain. Even at Camp Perry the National Individual Trophy Match (LEG) got rained out with high winds and had to be somewhat finished the next day, but that's another story.

This year's State Championship was again shot at the old FT MEADE ranges. The weather that morning did not look good, dark skies heavy overcast, it was not a question of whether it would rain – just when!

But thirty three die-hard High Power Shooters came to test their skill and luck for the State Championship. Range 1, the 600 yard range at Ft MEADE, can sometimes be a handful with its changing conditions. FT MEADE looks like a small version of Camp Perry with it's wide open field going for 3/4 of a mile out the right side of the range to a tree line on the left side of the range. It has been said time and again "If you can shoot a good score at FT MEADE you can do well anywhere".

The match started back at the 600 yard line, heavy overcast with some wind but making those little changes that you really had to keep up with or you were going pay with a bad score. The high shooter at 600 yards was John Harrison with a 198-5x, using a AR-15 "Space Gun". Second place at 600 yards was Jon Howell with a 197-11x, using a AR-15 Space Gun. Third place went to John Ondek with a 195-7x, using a AR-15 Service Rifle.

Now we have moved up to the 200 yard line for offhand, the rains are starting to come down start and stop...this is no fun when you are using match sights and it gets real fun if you have a Bob Jones lens in your rear sight and water gets in there. Any way, John Harrison won the offhand portion with a 194-2x. In second place was Steve Trent, with a 190-6x. Steve also used an AR-15 "Space Gun". In third place was Richard Kussman, with a 188-2x, using an AR-15, Service Rifle.

Now the fun comes with the rapid fire portions. Depending on what relay you were on, you either shot when the rain stopped and the sun was trying to come out or you got to shoot in a downpour. It started to rain so hard we were talking about calling the match, but there was no thunder or lightning yet so we pressed on, and we are glad we did. The rains did stop and with a slight overcast sky the rest of the event stayed dry. Anyway, the 200 yard sitting rapid fire got started and some really nice scores came up with John Harrison the winner again

"Side note" for the past few years we have started the match at 600yds instead of 200 yards, because we have to start the matches a 9.00am because of the range rules, which would make shooting at 600 yards around 4:00pm looking right into the sun.

away. (More to come on how we dealt with the remainder of the match.)

On Thursday, the day dawned with generally clear skies and lots of wind! It was Whistler Boy Day. The Whistler Boy is a 2-person junior team match. Maryland had 4 Whistler Boy teams on the line this year. Did I mention that it was very windy? As you might imagine, the standing stage was quite challenging! We don't have an opportunity to shoot in a lot of high wind conditions in Maryland, so this was a pretty new experience for our juniors. We finished in 39th, 63rd, 75th, and 94th places out of 107 teams. The Maryland Juniors are Matt Nelson, Jason Kruse, Ben Pinner, Blaine Griffith, Jonathan Smythe, Michael Andrews, Patrick Murphy, and Jonathan Kruse. The coaches and team captains were Jeff Davis, Matt Daley, Greg Blackstock, Jeff Andrews, John Ondek, Jenn Brostek, Bill Perry and the author. A big thank you is also in order for all the people that helped the juniors succeed this year by pulling targets, scoring, and verifying scores. THANKS!

Also on Thursday, for the first time there was an M-16 Excellence-in-Competition Match. This was an opportunity for folks that had not earned any points toward their Distinguished Shooters Badge to earn 4 points if they finished in the top 10%. We had several folks shoot the match, but alas, no one quite made the mark, this year. I know some of the folks would have like to try, but they were helping out with the Whistler Boy Match.

Back to the NTI. Since the NTI was called the day before, it was determined that the match would be completed following the Whistler Boy on Thursday. Things got off to a slow start, but everyone got their 300-yard rapid fires completed and we moved back to 600 yards for some slow fire. The 1st three relays shot their 600 yard scores and it was determined that it was too late and we weren't going to get the 600 yard phase done before it got dark. So, they truncated the match to include only 30 shots for record.

Friday was the National Trophy Team (NTT) Match. This is the "BIG" match of the Championships. We fielded to adult 6-person teams and a junior 6-person team. Again, it was quite windy (that's an understatement" so everyone's offhand scores suffered. Once we got off our "hind legs" we shot pretty well. But the ground we lost offhand just couldn't be made up. So....we decided to have a good time and enjoy ourselves. And we did! No records were set, but no one got hurt, so we had a good day.

Friday evening, we had our annual cookout. Lots of burgers and pork loin with all the fixings. Much thanks to Kevin, Jan and Marsha for pulling it all together.

Saturday dawned with high hopes for our Infantry Trophy Team (ITT). We managed to "borrow" a couple shooters from Illinois to field a Maryland/Illinois Composite Junior Team. We also fielded two adult teams. For one team things just didn't go too well. At the 600-yard phase, as the targets came up out of the pits, one of the targets fell out of the carrier. There are no alibis in the ITT, so we were automatically at a disadvantage since we had one less target to shoot at. When we began the string at the 500-yard line, one of the shooters had a malfunction and could not clear the rifle. So he didn't get his shots off. We did do a credible job at 300 yards and expended all the allotted ammo. Did we win the match or even place high??? No, but I think we all had a good time.

So ended the 2004 Camp Perry Experience. I think we all had a good time, got to meet old friends, and shopped till we dropped at the Commercial Row! Come out and join the fun next year.

## High Power Rifle Clinic



High Power Rifle shooting is alive and well in Maryland and the surrounding area. Practically every weekend from early spring till late fall there is a match somewhere in the area. From Cumberland in the west to Bridgeville, DE in the east, to Quantico Marine Base in the south and New Holland, PA in the north and Ft. Meade and AGC's Patapsco Range in the middle you will find enthusiasts shooting at targets from 200 to 600 yards and even 1000 yards. Many of the area shooters also attend the National Matches each August at Camp Perry, Ohio. A number of clubs and the Maryland State Rifle Pistol Association have formed High Power Rifle teams.

The High Power Rifle Clinic is presented by the Monumental Rifle and Pistol Club with assistance from the Associated Gun Clubs of Baltimore (AGC) and the Maryland State Rifle Team. The clinic is run once a year in the late winter in preparation for the following High Power match season. Anyone with an interest in High Power Rifle Match shooting is invited to attend.

The purpose of the clinic is to introduce shooters to the basic techniques of High Power Rifle shooting and to prepare the shooter to enter his or her first matches. The emphasis is on match shooting and the person looking for instruction on how to shoot a deer rifle is advised to find an NRA basic rifle course.

The course consists of two days of classroom instruction and three days on the firing range. Instruction consists of such topics as safety, equipment, position, sights, trigger control, match procedures and rifle maintenance. On the range we refine these topics and coach the student through the various strings of fire. The student is then coached through a complete match.

The coaches are all highly qualified High Power Rifle shooters, most of whom hold NRA Master and High Master Classifications.

The clinic will have M1 Garands and M1A rifles for use of the students. There will also be AR-15 rifles available to Junior shooters.

The clinic is held on Sundays:

February 27	8:00 am to 3:00 pm.
March 6	8:00 am to 3:00 pm.
March 13	9:00 am to 4:00 pm
March 20	9:00 am to 4:00 pm
April 3	9:00 am to 4:00 pm

The clinic will be held at the AGC Range, Marriottsville, MD, about 10 miles west of Baltimore.

Cost of the clinic is \$50.00. Junior shooters (under 21) are free. Preregistration is required. The clinic will be limited to the first 40 persons to register.
